Worplesdon Parish Council (WPC)

Worplesdon Parish Council has, like many other organisations, found the last year challenging but the councillors and Officers of the Council (Clerks) have tried very hard to continue to deliver services throughout the various restrictions of the past year.

We continue to try and ensure that our parish looks as good as possible through the contracts for grass cutting and ensuring that the verges are cut regularly. We work closely with Guildford Borough Council and Surrey County Council and submit comments on planning applications relevant to Worplesdon Council. The planning application for Weyside Urban Village is due very shortly for consideration by GBC and will impact on the parish, especially the village of Jacobs Well. WPC has submitted comments to the planning application for this.

WPC are still in consultation with Surrey County Council regarding the new bus shelter and water garden (soakaway) to help alleviate the flooding in the area of Oak Tree Close.

We conduct regular visits to the playgrounds in the parish and maintain the fabric of other facilities in the parish. Our groundsman, Peter, works hard to keep paths and alleys clear in the parish.

WPC held a tea party to thank many of the volunteers that helped to keep the parish ticking over during the Covid lockdowns. It was attended by over 70 volunteers and was enjoyed by all. We continue to hold the Remembrance Ceremony each year in Harry's Meadow and this will again be happening this year on the 11th at 10.50am for those wishing to join.

Bus Routes 34 & 35

Attention of users of bus company Arriva Route 34 and Route 35 (and 134/135 users). Surrey County Council (SCC) understands that Arriva UK Bus is intending to cease operating bus services in Surrey from mid-December 2021.

Following this announcement, I am delighted to learn that they are in advance stage of discussions with Falcon Coaches to take over their operations later this year. This is great news for both Arriva staff and bus service users.

I am very aware that many of our residents rely on these services to get them to work, school, medical appointments and to access a wide range of other services, Surrey County Council has been working with Arriva to achieve a positive outcome on behalf of all our residents. Locally, I will be pressing to ensure that routes 34 and 35, through Jacobs Well are maintained.

SCC remains committed to supporting public transport and making it as easy as possible for people to rely less on their cars.

Surrey County Council

I was very pleased to attend the AGM of the Jacobs Well Residents Association and give a report on matters affecting Jacobs Well. It was the first "in person" village meeting in two years and it was really good to see people face to face again.

Flooding alleviation scheme, roundabout Woking Road junction of SaltBox Road

This site is with the County Council's flooding and highways teams to identify the best options available. They are going to carry out some local repairs to help manage the flooding, and will then be going to the design phase of a "rain garden" which is a nice name for a large soakaway, to make the area more resilient against surface water flooding. This is at its early stages so the local maintenance team will need to manage the situation until they have a better idea of the timescale and identify the funding required.

At the same location, Guildford bound, it is hoped to install a new bus shelter, which needs to be coordinated in conjunction with the rain garden project.

Road safety - Road Tables, Clay Lane

I advised residents in March that funding for this scheme, aimed at slowing down traffic speeds in Clay Lane, was approved by the Guildford Joint Committee. A scheme has been designed, and I'm happy to send any resident a copy of the drawings. The scheme should be constructed sometime between January and March 2022.

Speed limits

Also agreed earlier in the year, the section of Jacobs Well Road that has a 40mph should be reduced to 30mph. These proposals have to go through a legal process but are in hand.

The speed limit on the whole length of Salt Box Road was reduced in April from 60mph (national speed limit) to 40mph, with clearer signage, and residents have reported improvements.

Trees

A number of new trees have been planted in local roads, including at the triangle junction of Clay Lane and Woking Road, as part of SCC's programme to plant 1.2 million trees across Surrey (one for each resident of the County) in conjunction with other organisations. Suggested locations are welcome and should be submitted to: trees@surreycc.gov.uk for consideration.

Grass verges

Two issues have been raised, the maintenance of grass verges and parking on grass verges. For the maintenance, Surrey County Council contracts Guildford Borough Council (parks dept) to cut verges in Guildford. In turn, GBC subcontracts that work in Worplesdon to Worplesdon Parish Council, whose ground staff carry it out. The Countywide contracts are up for renewal in 2022 and so discussions are being held with GBC.

Update from Guildford Borough Council

Car Free Day: More than 24,000 people visited Guildford town centre when the car free Day was held in September. The total number of visitors is the highest since April, when we saw an unprecedented number of people hit the High Street. It's also an increase of 16% from the previous Sunday. Several roads were closed to make space for stalls and activities and help people to have a more enjoyable day out. Car free day is part of how Guildford Borough Council is using the £140,000 welcome back fund. The government scheme is providing councils across England with a share of £56 million from the European regional development fund. This is to support the safe return to the High Street and help rebuild after the pandemic.

Guildford is bidding for City status: The formal status of a city is given by the monarch and this year the Queen will be announcing new cities in England, Wales and Scotland. It's the first time in 10 years that towns have been able to make the case for City status.

Burpham Court Farm: Guildford Borough Council turned down a planning application to convert the agricultural buildings to four residential dwellings. The developers appealed this decision to the Planning Inspectorate who overruled Guildford Borough Council's refusal and granted permission to the developer for the conversion.

Weyside Urban Village (WUV): There will be a special planning committee meeting regarding Weyside Urban Village on the 20th October, and I will provide you with a report at the next meeting.

Centenary of the passing of 'Abdu'l-Bahá

This year marks 100 years of the passing of a unique human being. He distinguished himself not for any social position or material characteristic, but for His selfless service to humanity. He was known as 'Abdu'l-Bahá, meaning "Servant of the Glory of God".

His was a spiritual life, in deed and in word. He exemplified the teachings of the Bahá'í Faith and guided it through difficult times as the Centre of the Covenant made by Bahá'u'lláh with His followers. He was honoured with a knighthood from the British Empire in April 1920.

He chose for Himself the title of "servant", and that is how He lived His life. Although ten thousand mourners of various religious backgrounds attended His funeral, millions today are inspired by His life and writings and strive to follow His sterling example in their daily lives.
